• Organizing and conducting various competitions and sports competitions for women at the university in order to increase the effectiveness of the tasks assigned to them;

Duties of Council Members





Master's degree students' admission statistics (2020-2021)



The proportion of male and female students admitted Overall, It can be seen from the graph that more women than men applied for all directions. Although the Computer Linguistics direction was usually applied by men, due to the TSUULL program named "Encouraging women in subjects where they are underrepresented".

It can be seen from the graph that the big number of students opted for Philology and teaching languages direction, female accounting for a massive 228, male being ten times fewer in number. The second big proportion is Uzbek Language and Literature direction, admitted female students are 218 and male students figuring for 32. The third famous direction among others is Translation theory and practice, again female students leading with 118 in total, only 32 male students were admitted to this direction.
