At TSUULL, we firmly believe that economic constraints should never be a barrier to the pursuit of academic excellence and the realization of one's intellectual destiny. As a beacon of higher learning, we embrace the brightest and most innovative individuals – the emerging pioneers in various academic disciplines.

Our ethos is grounded in the conviction that education is a transformative force, one that should be accessible to the brightest minds, whether they hail from bustling city centers or the most secluded rural locales.

An education at TSUULL does more than just impart knowledge; it serves as a catalyst for change, empowering young individuals with the skills, insight, and vision required to leave an indelible mark on society. We are deeply grateful for the support that makes this transformation possible, aiding us in our mission to sculpt the leaders and innovators of tomorrow.

Aligning with the first Sustainable Development Goal, TSUULL is steadfast in its commitment to dismantle poverty by fostering academic accessibility and community support. SDG 1's ambitious aim is the eradication of poverty in all its manifestations across the globe. Currently, an estimated 10% of the global population lives below the poverty line, struggling to meet essential needs. This challenge spans beyond employment, with 8% of workers worldwide still living in poverty, and affects children disproportionately, with one in five children facing extreme poverty conditions.



Access to Education and Accommodation

In 2016, TSUULL opened new campus facilities that extend beyond educational spaces to offer affordable housing, significantly benefiting rural students who otherwise have limited educational access. The 672-bed dormitory is not just a residence but a nurturing environment that cultivates a close-knit student community, critical for those uprooted from their home for the first time. By providing such infrastructure, TSUULL creates educational inroads for those who face accommodation barriers.

Our experienced staff guide students through housing searches, assisting with legalities and documentation for rental agreements. Moreover, qualifying students can receive a rent subsidy, with the Uzbekistan government providing a state subsidy and TSUULL subsidizing 60% of the rent.

TSUULL further eases the burden of accommodation costs for: Individuals with disabilities. Students who have lost family providers. Students from families listed in 'Temir Daftar', 'Women's Daftar', 'Yoshlar Daftar'.

Students with multiple siblings enrolled in fee-paying courses. Facilities are meticulously tailored for inclusivity, with accessible design for physically challenged students, ensuring that no one is left behind due to mobility issues.

Educational Grants for International Students

Recognizing that poverty is both a lack of resources and opportunities, TSUULL has implemented free master's degree courses for individuals from economically disadvantaged backgrounds. For instance, following a memorandum with the Afghan Ministry of Higher Education, we welcomed 13 graduate students to our master's program for the 2021-2022 academic year, bolstering our commitment to educational equity.

Empowering the Student Body True to the ethos of SDG 1, we ensure all students, especially the impoverished and vulnerable, are granted equal rights and opportunities. Our Student Support Community proactively identifies and engages with new entrants from low-income families, providing immediate assistance once necessary documentation is validated.

Through these concerted efforts, TSUULL not only advances educational pursuits but also contributes to the global fight against poverty, empowering individuals to change their lives and, by extension, their communities.
