The TSUULL University has focused on:

Holistic Approach: sustainability as the basis of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals [SDGs] is the necessary element of every program that TSUULL University is delivered and basically integrated into a number of aspects as library resources, volunteer programs, student festivals and other types of student engagement and representation. And therefore, the University undertakes projects focused on a number of areas including: research and teaching to empower students.

Scientific Research: interdisciplinary and mainly Linguistics research add new information and perspectives on the development of University. Our research is scientifically rigorous and shared with the worldwide community through scientific publications in such journals as 'Uzbekistan: Language and Culture', 'Oltin bitiglar – Golden Scripts' etc.

Quality of Education: improving the conditions for students for their right to education is a fundamental part of the work we do. Our principles are based on the belief that in order to permanently solve poverty, we must be linked closely to developmental activities. We also believe an educated and healthy community leads to better decision-making.


Capacity Building: we have partnered with many Universities to train graduate students in the methods of language translation and provide valuable field experience. More to say, we aid them in supporting research and courses.

Student accommodation at TSUULL


In 2016, the University opened TSUULL all campuses which enabled students to get a place to live while studying for a very cheap price. The 672-bed residence is designed to be a home-away-from-home for students, that promotes a sense of community and facilitates.Through facilities such as this, the University provides a pathway to study for students who might otherwise experience challenges in finding accommodation.

TSUULL always support people who come from low-income families and the criteria for accommodation is loosened for

- people with I, II disabled;
- students who have lost their breadwinners;
- students whose families are regulated in "Temir Daftar", "Women's Daftar", "Yoshlar Daftar";
- students who have 2 or more fee-paying students in their family.

The university has created all conditions and facilities for disabled and disabled students in need of social protection. In particular, ramps have been built in front of the student residences and inside the educational buildings for students with physical disabilities who use wheelchairs. There are also special elevators for going up to the upper floors.

Each of the separate rooms for students with disabilities has facilities for bathing and washing (bath, shower, sink). A comfortable opportunity has been created for him to move from a wheelchair to a bed.



Allowance to study online

During 2020-2021 academic year, a number of low income students, pregnant and nursing the baby students who find it difficult to come to the campus has been allowed to continue their studies online and given a tutor to be aware of their conditions in a daily basis.

Financial support

A total of 3190 students study at TSUULL in 2020-2021. 2580 of them are girls, and 610 are boys. There are 1,820 first-year students, 1,568 girls and 262 boys at this stage.

There are 468 students in the family studying at a higher educational institution alone, 396 of them are girls, and 72 are boys.

The total number of students with disabilities studying from the 1st to the 4th year is 62. Among these, 38 girls and 24 boys. In addition, there are 3 people with disabilities working in the university, namely, 2 women and one male.

World Mental Health Day (WMH Day), 10 October 2021

Around the world one in four people will have some kind of mental illness during their lifetime. Around 450 million people are living with a mental health problem right now, making it one of the biggest health issues in the world. Yet people rarely talk about any mental health problems they have because there is still a lot of stigma.

University's summary of activities for this goal across engagement and education:

1. The course about Public Policy introduces TSUULL students to the use of methods of the analysis of public policy. A variety of public policy topics are covered including eco-tourism, health care, education, homeless, employment, poverty and inequality. Undergraduate students also have the opportunity to learn about No Poverty in an economic context.

2. Sustainable Food

Volunteers grow sustainable food at the Community Garden on the TSUULL Campus. Our community are students, staff and all community members working hard to launch a space for growing food around the Campus. During 2021, we held 12 open sessions on how to grow vegetables and what is the most important impact.

Undergraduate students are guaranteed a place in the dormitory.


Orientation events for international students took place at the same time as for home students at the Freshmen school fair where foreign students could talk to advisors from central University services and a number of visa presentations were held at the start of term. They also received induction information from your college and department about academic and social life at TSUULL.

Uzbek Language courses for free

During 2021 more than 94 foreign students from different countries learnt Uzbek Language in TSUULL Uzbek Language course. Students coming from developing countries like Afghanistan, Nepal, Africa were provided free of charge classes.

During their stay they not only learn the language but also culture which makes it easy adapt and live.





TSUULL Admission advantage

People with disabilities, 16 children of military servicemen, 29 women from low income families, 7 applicants with a letter of recommendation from a military unit, 1 winner of the "brave boy" award, 4 graduates of the boarding school named after Ishaqkhan Ibrat were admitted to study on the basis of a state grant, and 16 applicants with a letter of recommendation from a military unit were admitted to study on the basis of a payment contract.
