She additionally manages the “Go to East” Summer School Program, supported by DAAD, where international students immerse themselves in Uzbek language and culture.

Her leadership has contributed to the university's growing recognition in international rankings, particularly in the Times Higher Education (THE) University Impact Rankings, where the institution has excelled in areas such as gender equality and educational impact.
