Project purpose: Translation of historical data of the Uzbek statehood in the written monuments (epigraphs, documents, etc.) in the Sogdian language from the last centuries of the first millennium BC to the end of the first millennium AD, writing comments, to conduct unknown or controversial research on current issues, to write articles and pamphlets on this basis and to publish them in the local and foreign press.

Main objective: The Sogdians, who lived between the Amu Darya and Syrdarya rivers in the 2nd and 12th centuries BC, have a rich cultural heritage. As a contribution to the civilization of Central Asia, the Sogdians left their mark on the history of the people of the region, not only in the branches of the Great Silk Road passing through this region, but also from Eastern Europe to the Far East, the Urals and Southern Siberia. to ensure that the indigenous peoples of northern India and Tibet were aware of the cultural innovations created in different parts of the world.

Expected results: Sogdian words and phrases preserved in the Uzbek language were identified and materials were collected for the preparation of scientific pamphlets, scientific articles were written on them, reports were presented at scientific conferences; Sogdian epigraphic, heraldic and numismatic materials were collected, their texts were translated into Uzbek, new readings and historical commentaries were made, on the basis of which 1 scientific monograph and 1 pamphlet were published (Boboyorov G. , Goyibov B., Kubatin A.
