Donation Program For Students

We would like to share the social responsibility initiative of our University - Donation Program. This Donation Program aims at achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) of the United Nations Agenda 2030. The University Foundation provides partial or full assistance to the students with financial shortage from remote places of Uzbekistan with the highest level of poverty.

University increases the number of opportunities for low-income family students. For example, in 2021, there were approximately 280 students who need financial support. This number increased to 300 in 2022. University provided these students with financial support and this figure is around 316 in 2023, and university give both financial and educational support such as scholarships and free language courses for these students.

Apart from these, we also try to provide students with free tickets to cultural activities such as museums, parks and theatres to enjoy their free time.

Orhun exchange program

We have supported our students through the Orhun Exchange Program.

The Orhun Exchange Programme aims to facilitate the exchange of students and academic staff among Turkish Council Universities members. 2023-2024 Academic Year Fall and Spring Semester ORHUN exchange program applications have started for undergraduate, graduate (must be in the course stage) and PhD students and Academic Staff who want to study for a semester in the announced departments of the member universities of the Organization of Turkic States Turkic Universities Union. Students do not pay any tuition fees to the host institution during the programme, but they continue to pay the obligatory tuition fees to their home institutions. At TSUULL, three students has already been winners of this exchange program and study at International Universities.

I am a bachelor student who had been accepted for ORHUN Student Exchange Program 2023. I studied at Ege University in Izmir (Türkiye) from October 2, 2023, through February 2, 2024 for a semester. That was a great opportunity to get more experience and interact with international students. Majority of tuition fees were covered by exchange program and that was a great financial support
