Facilities for students with Disabilities

Our university is committed to providing comprehensive facilities for students with disabilities. We have established accessible walkways, elevators, and computer labs to ensure an inclusive environment. These resources are designed to guarantee that all students have equal opportunities to acquire knowledge and develop their skills. In addition to physical accessibility, we offer specialized support services, including tutoring, mentoring, and counseling tailored to meet diverse needs. Our dedicated staff is trained to assist students in navigating academic challenges, and we actively promote awareness and understanding throughout the campus community. By fostering an inclusive atmosphere, we aim to empower every student to thrive and succeed in their educational journey.



The university has a nursery available to students and staff with children aged from three months to five years. It is a primary facility for students, although places are also available for the children of university staff. Children may attend this center for a minimum of four hours per day.
