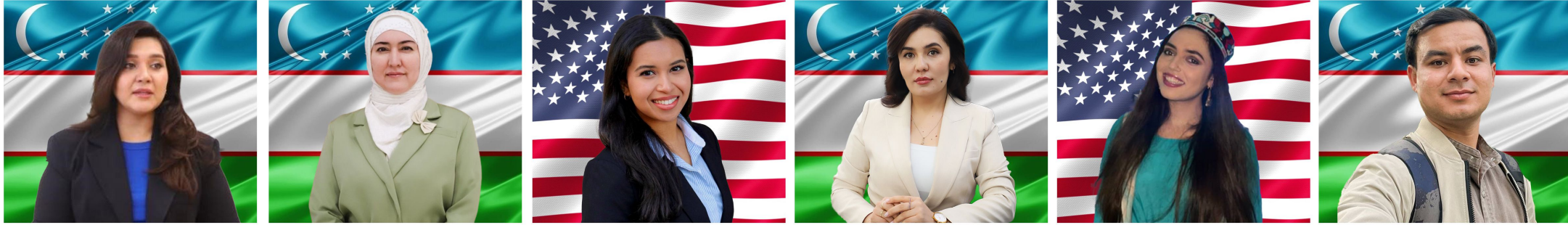

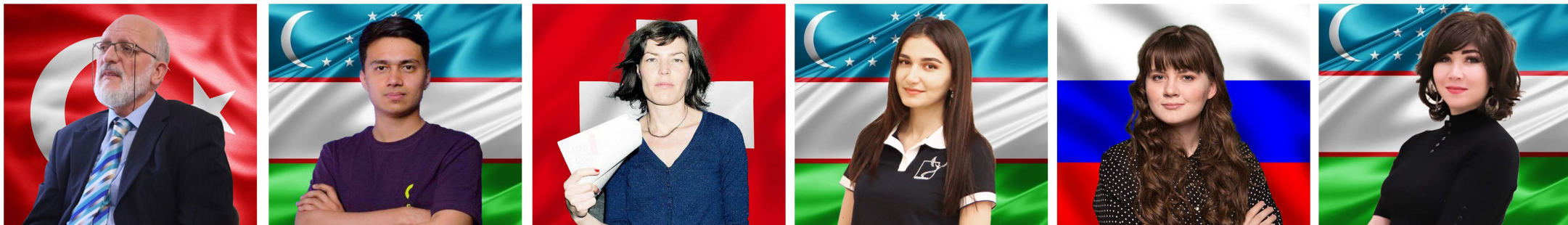


The main objectives of the TSUULL Open Lectures Series are as follows:

During the previous year, TSUULL accomplished professors conducted a series of open lectures covering topics related to Stylistics, Phonetics, and Literature. These lectures were conducted in the main campus building and were attended by a diverse audience, including students, researchers, schoolteachers, and enthusiastic learners from the community.

TSUULL's commitment to promoting quality education and lifelong learning aligns seamlessly with Sustainable Development Goal 4. By providing access to a wealth of educational resources, including a comprehensive library and open lecture series, TSUULL contributes not only to the education of its students but also to the empowerment and enrichment of the local community. Updating Curriculum

Several changes were made to the Hemis assessment system at TSUULL. Now, all faculty members assess students using this system. Additionally, the necessary manuscripts and books have been uploaded, allowing students to download them freely. Our goal promotes lifelong learning by encouraging students' access to affordable, quality technical and vocational education

Improving Teaching Methodology

Several associations have been established with the university to support students in their educational pursuits. Three local neighborhoods, three schools, one college, and one creativity school are now supported by the university. As a result, many students have gained valuable opportunities that enhance their academic experience.



Encouraging Research Activities

Our university hosts several journals that publish articles indexed in Scopus, SAC, and those with an Impact Factor. Among these, Scopus is regarded as the most prestigious. In 2023, a total of 34 faculty members had their articles published in Scopus journals. Furthermore, 182 articles were published in “OAK” journals, and 138 articles were published in journals with high impact factor.

Organizing Conferences & Seminars

The departments of Linguistics, Computer Linguistics, and Uzbek Literature at TSUULL successfully organized a total of 19 conferences. Of these, 11 were conducted at the international level, while 7 were held at the national level. Notably, 10 of the conferences were primarily online, and the remaining 8 were conducted in a hybrid format, incorporating both online and offline participation.



Developing International Relations

TSUULL has successfully strengthened partnerships with 20 universities across Tajikistan, Germany, Korea, Türkiye, French, Indonesia, Budapest and Kyrgyzstan. These collaborations have resulted in:

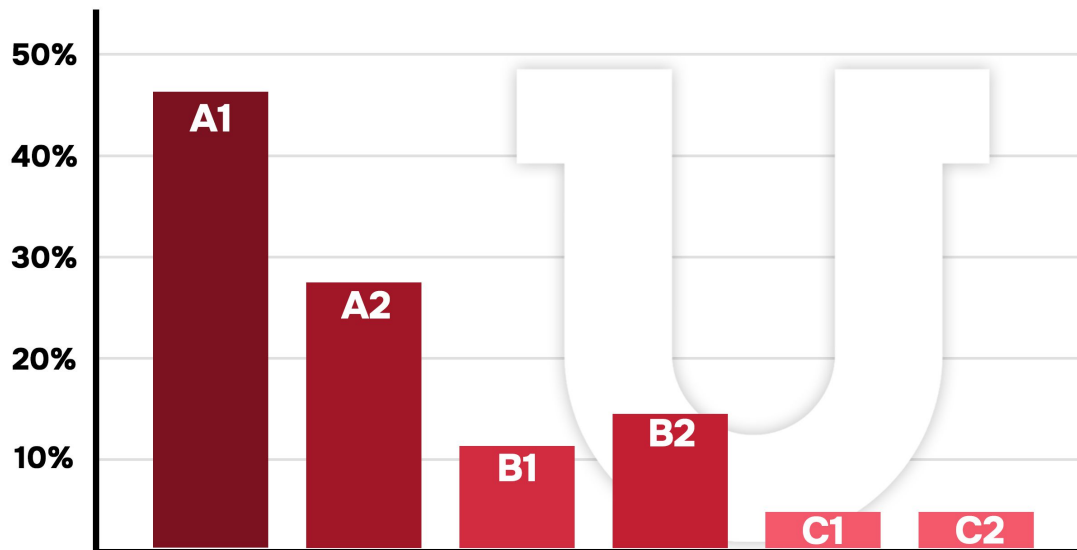
Student Mobility Programs: a large amount of students took advantage of exchange opportunities, gaining international experience and broadening their academic horizons.

Developing Academic Mobility

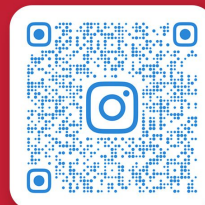
TSUULL engages in esteemed exchange programs, including Fulbright, Orhun, and Erasmus, all designed to enhance academic collaboration and cultural exchange. We hosted 3 Fulbright ETAs from different States so far and provided exchange opportunities for 3 students to The Orhun Program which fosters connections among Turkic-speaking nations.



Uzbek school extended the number of Uzbek language learners and over 200 hundred international students including Korea, China, USA, Brazil, France, Turkey, Germany, Japan, and India finished different levels of language courses. Executive Educational Training Centre

The aim of the Center is to fully implement the state language and ensure that the norms and rules of written Uzbek literary language, based on the Latin script, are effectively applied in state language administration. It aims to continuously develop the skills of employees in state organizations by regularly updating the necessary knowledge and skills in this area. It offered four different courses:

1. The norms of conducting official work in Uzbek language. The Uzbek alphabet based on the Latin script and spelling, the basics of conducting official work in the state language, and the preparation of official documents, the 'Course on the Norms of the Uzbek Literary Language and Conducting Official Work in the State Language' was being conducted.

2. Improving the speech culture and the oratory skills of civil servants. Developing to fundamentally enhance the prestige and status of the Uzbek language as the state language. The course primarily improved the ability of civil service employees to convey their thoughts clearly and eloquently.

3. Norms of writing in Uzbek Literary Language for the General Public. The main goal of the course is was to improve the written speech culture of the population, to teach the norms of the Uzbek literary language to the general public, to learn how to express thoughts clearly, fluently, and correctly through written speech.

4. The general norms of writing in Uzbek Literary Language. The course was mainly focused on improving citizens' skills in expressing their thoughts clearly, coherently, and stylistically correctly in written form. This was especially important for official and business-related documents.
