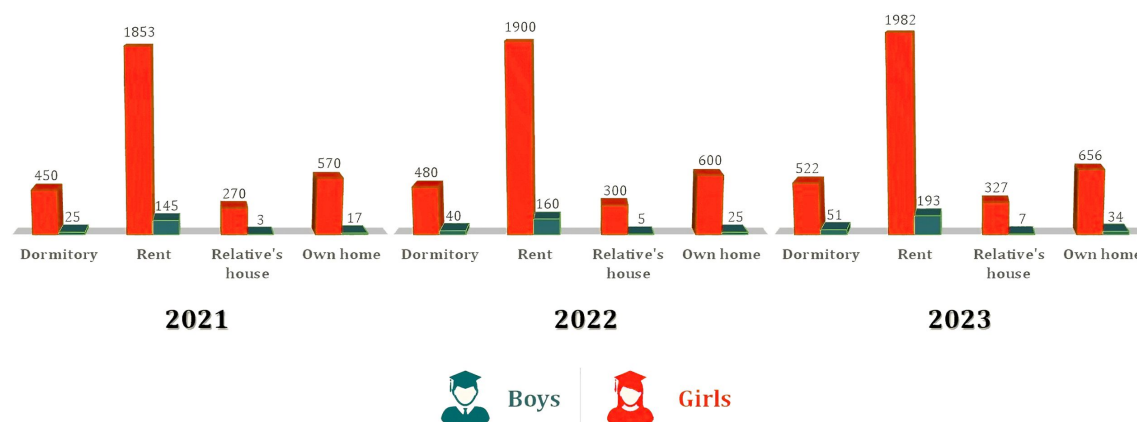
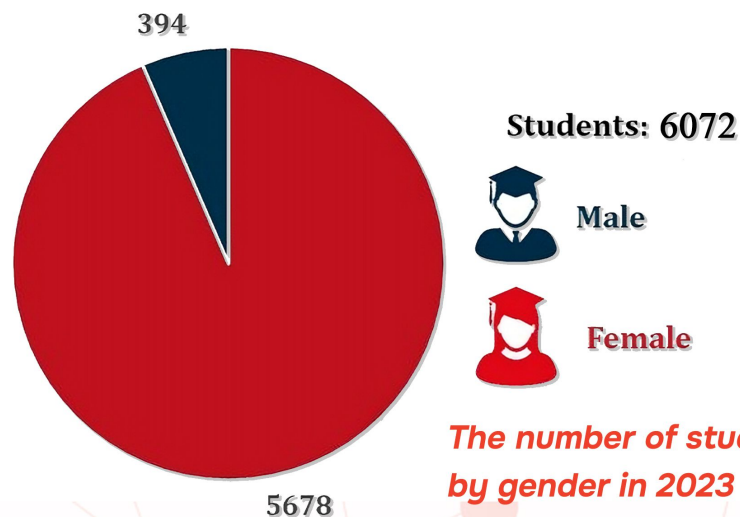
The number of visitors of sdg5.tsuull.uz website by gender and age



Our programs related to gender equality have been updated with new content, and additional features are currently being revised. The number of site visitors has significantly increased. Our programs support the career development of female students by offering practical courses, many of which are conducted by the students themselves.



Student Acces and Participation Track Review

At TSUULL, the student body comprises 6,072 individuals, with a significant majority of 5,678 female students. Among them, 1,118 are on grants and 2,586 on contract, highlighting the university's dedication to supporting women's education. The distribution of students across various programs, including undergraduates and distance learners, reflects a strong female representation. The university also prioritizes accommodation support, providing 573 students with dormitory housing in 2023, predominantly female, and assisting 2,175 students in finding off-campus rentals through mentoring schemes.



International Impact Rankings

We have been participating in this prestigious ranking since **2022**. In its first participation in **2022**, TSUULL positioned **1001+** in THE Impact Rankings. By **2023**, the university advanced to the top **600+** universities worldwide. This year, in its third participation, our university has impressively secured a place among the top **300+** universities globally. The university's achievements extend beyond gender equality. Notably, the university ranks among the **top 10** worldwide for ensuring gender equality. Initiatives such as launching a special platform to combat gender inequality, organizing podcasts, and hosting open dialogues on current issues have contributed to this success.

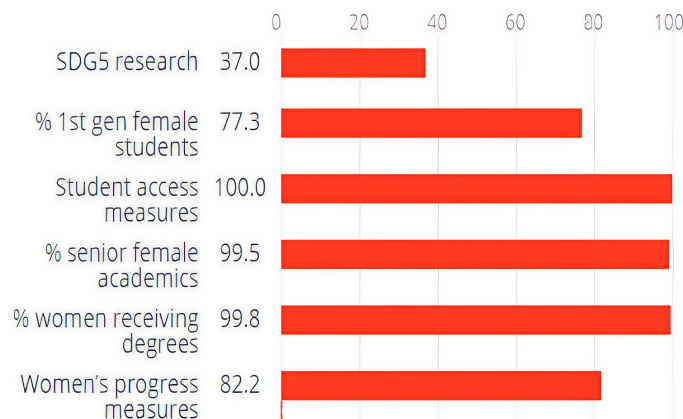

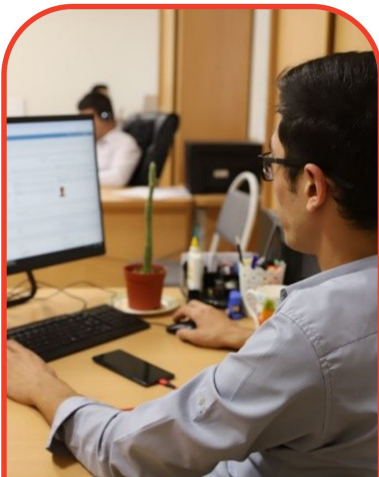

Let Girls Speak Out



The new social project "Qizlar Gapirsin" (Let Girls Speak Out) highlights TSUULL's achievement of ranking among the top 600+ universities globally, especially in gender equality, where it placed in the top 20. This initiative includes a podcast on YouTube that addresses gender equality issues and shares solutions for challenges faced by women and girls. Initial episodes feature inspiring discussions with Uzbek women, including Professor Dilsora Komil on feminism and Hilola Nazirova on women's historical significance. These themes included "The Importance of Women's Education", "Gender Equality", "Women Empowerment", "Psychology of women" and various important topics.
